<u>North/Canyon Lake</u>: Bluebonnets and Texas Permissions are blooming. Hives have lots of brood and queens are doing good. Frames have some capped honey, nectar and there is pollen coming in.

West: Same, and splits are happening now.

<u>Inner City</u>: There was a notable nectar flow but now a dearth. Texas mt laurel and redbud were blooming. Lots of pollen which is now slowing down. At the beginning of March there was some honey being capped. Swarm cells in 10 hives and have made lots of splits.

<u>East</u>: Bluebonnets, dandelions blooming; pollen coming in but no nectar yet. <u>Boerne</u>: A little nectar, lots of pollen but Bam - has stopped. Now in a dearth. Hives are brooded up and hungry so bees are not in very good moods. Giving splashes of syrup and making sure the queen has room to lay. Highly encourages folks to wax their frames.
